Swillington Parish Council-Explanation of Variances year ending 2017/18

Note 2 Annual Precept

In 2016/17 the precept was £28,101 and it was increased to £28,500 in 2017/18. This resulted in an increase of £399, which equates to an increase of ±1.4%.

Note 3 Total other Receipts

In 2016/17 the total receipts were £34,172, and in 2017/18 they reduced to £15,378 a decrease of £18,794 which equates to -55%. In 2016/17 we received a number of grants which included Tesco's Bag Scheme of £12,000 and from WREN for a new boiler costing £3,700. We did not receive any similar grants in 2017/18 hence a reduction in our income.

Note 4 Staff Costs

In 2016/17 our staff costs were £19,169 and in 2017/18 were £19,064. The staff costs have remained fairly static just a small decrease of -0.5. The council employee who was on maternity leave has returned and maternity allowance paid recouped from HMRC which absorbed the increase in hourly rates paid to staff in this year and resulted in this decrease. The last quarter of tax paid for 2017/18 was paid in the New Year.

Note 6 Other Payments

In 2016/17 other payments were £46,448 which reflected the grants received and the subsequent increase in payments for the new playground equipment and improvements to the Village Hall. Our spend in 2017/18 was £20,473 as we did not receive any grant funding in 2017/18. This was a -56% reduction in spend.

Note 9 Fixed Assets and Long Term Assets

In 2016/17 our assets totalled £201,320, in 2017/18 they totalled £195,253 this was because an old item of playground equipment was written off due to vandalism. This was a reduction of -0.03%.
